



# The Twelve Days of Christmas...for Teachers

Last year, parents in my children's classes donated an average of \$10, resulting in \$150-\$200 for the teachers' Christmas gifts. I created a 12 Days Gift Bag for each, and simply changed the gift tags to say, "On the first day of Christmas, my students gave to me..." Can you imagine the chatter in the hallways as I walked in with these bags, overflowing with fluff, cellophane, and curling ribbon?! The teachers were instructed to open one gift per school day, beginning on the 12th day before Christmas break. And if they forgot, the students reminded them! One teacher referred to her bag as her "Mary Kay-mas" gifts!

## Suggested gift items:

Gloves with Hand Cream

Past PCP gift premiums (Eyeshadow Quads, Travel Microdermabrasion, Travel-size Satin Hands, Cosmetic Bag filled with samples)

Tinted Lip Balm

Lip Gloss

Energizing Lotion for Feet and Legs in a pair of Christmas socks

Oil Free Eye Makeup Remover

Ultimate Mascara

Satin Lips Mask and Balm

Coffee Mug with Gourmet Cocoa and a purse-size Hand/Decollete Cream

\*Tweak it to work within your budget. I was about \$20 short on each gift, so I considered the \$10 wholesale plus the packaging to be my contribution.

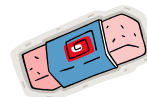


## Teacher Survival Kit

8. "Coat" ~ Mascara
9. "Playground Duty Must-Haves" ~ Satin Lip Balm and Energizing Lotion for Feet and Legs
10. "Gym Class Cleanup" ~ 2-in-1 Body Wash and Shave
11. "Nap Time" ~ Indulge Soothing Eye Gel (aka "Nap in a Jar")
12. "Break Room Goodies" ~ Mug with Cocoa and peppermint candies

On the Second Day of Christmas, my students gave to me... a CRAYON to color my lips!!



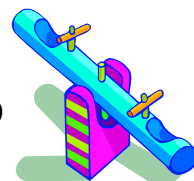

On the Tenth Day of Christmas, my students gave to me...something for GYM CLASS CLEANUP!



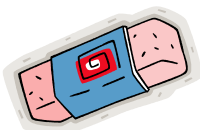
On the Fifth Day of Christmas, my students gave to me... eye shadow GLUE!
